RULES

WESTERLEY ROAD CLUB

- 1. That the Club be called the "WESTERLEY ROAD CLUB."
- 2. That the membership of the Club shall, subject as hereinafter mentioned, be limited to regular riding male members of the Western and/or West Middlesex Sections of the Metropolitan District Association who are full members of the Cyclists' Touring Club. Prospective members shall be subject to the Committee's approval. Any member wishing to resign must do so before the 31st December otherwise he will be liable for his subscription for the ensuing year.
- 3. That any person who has been a member of the Club for not less than three years, who, in the opinion of the Committee, has ceased to be an active member of the Club and is no longer a member of the Cyclists' Touring Club shall not be debarred by reason of these facts from enjoying all other rights and privileges of membership of the Westerley Road Club. Such member shall be termed an Associate Member. An Associate Member shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Club and shall pay a subscription of the same amount as a non-racing member.
- 4. That a first claim member is one who at the time of his election was a member of no other Cycling Club, the Cyclists' Touring Club excepted, or who has since the date of his election resigned membership of the club or clubs of which he was a member at the time of his election.
- 5. That there shall be an entry fee of one shilling and a yearly subscription of five shillings for racing members and three shillings and sixpence for non-racing members. Should any member not pay his subscription within six weeks from the 1st January the Treasurer shall write notifying the same, if then unpaid the debtor will be liable to be ruled a non-member.
- 6. That persons joining the Club on or after the 15th September in any year shall be entitled to membership for the following year without further subscription.

7. That any person wishing to join as a Secondclaim member and elected on or after the 25th March 1926 should not be eligible to enter for time standards medals or compete in the Championship for a period

of three years.

8. That the Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, Vice-President or Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, General Secretary, Racing Secretary, "Open 100" Secretary, Gazette Editor, Auditor or Auditors, Time-keepers and Handicapping Committee of three members, such body to be appointed by the General Committee.

9. That the Committee shall consist of the President, Treasurer, General Secretary, Racing Secretary, Open 100" Secretary, Gazette Editor and three other members all of whom, with the exception of the President, shall be elected at the Annual General

Meeting.

10. That there shall be a panel of not more than s.x Vice-Presidents. Candidates for the office of Vice-President shall be members of the Club. Candidates shall be nominated by the Committee and shall be alected by the Club in General Meeting.

- That the Committee has the right to suspend any member whose conduct in its opinion is injurious to the character of the Club until such date as a General Meeting can be called when a motion to expel such member can be moved; no member can be suspended unless he is given notice of the intention of the Committee to proceed against him and is given an opportunity of defending himself at a meeting of the Committee or before the Club in General Meeting.
- 12. The Committee shall be at liberty to arrange twelve Club Runs during each year, race days being utilised when possible.
- 13. That the number of events each season shall be determined by the Committee who shall have the right to withdraw any event if sufficient support is not forthcoming.
- 14. That Officers elected at the Annual General Meeting shall take office within fourteen days.
- 15. That the events be arranged in conjunction with the. Western and West Middlesex Sections of the Metropolitan District Association in such a way as to cause no interference with those Sections.

16. That a Special General Meeting may be called at the earliest date upon the Secretary receiving a notice signed by not less than seven members and the General Secretary must give at least seven days' notice to all members of the Club of all General Meetings.

17. That the Annual General Meeting be held within one calendar month of the end of the Club's

year

18. That no rule shall be altered except by a two-thirds majority attending and voting at a General Meeting of the Club. The Committee shall have power to make further rules providing they do not negative existing rules, it being incumbent upon the Committee to see that notice in writing of any addition to the Rules is given to all members within seven days.

19. That no question shall be considered by the Club in General Meeting unless notice of such question appears on the Agenda for that meeting, or permission for its discussion is granted by three quarters of the

Members present at such meeting.

20. That the Club Championship shall be awarded on an average speed basis at distances of 25 miles, 50 miles, 100 miles and 12 hours. Rides for inclusion in the Championship may be done in Club events, private time trials and in all open and Association events approved by the Road Time Trials Council.

Rules for Handicaps and Time Trials

1. That the Club standard times for single bicycles shall be computed by adding to the current English competition record time, at the respective distances, nine per centum of such record time for the Gold Standard fifteen per centum of such record time for the Silver Standard and twenty-two per centum of such record time for the Bronze Standard. That the Club Standard Times for Tandem bicycles shall be computed by adding to the current competition record time at the respective distances eight per centum of such record time for the gold standard, fourteen per centum of such record time for the silver standard and twentytwo per centum of such record time for the bronze standard, and that the Club Standard Times for tricycles shall be computed by adding to the current competition record time, at the respective distances, six per centum of such record time for the gold standard, ten per centum of such record time for the

silver standard, and sixteen per centum of such record time for the bronze standard. Any adjustments made necessary by the improvement of any competition record shall be made at the conclusion of the racing season in which the improvement has been made and shall not be operative until the next following racing season.

2. Entry fees for handicaps and time trials shall be paid prior to the commencement of the event.

3. Entrance fees to Handicaps shall be fixed by the Committee, entrance fees for Time Trials (other than fees for multiple Time Trials) and non-competitive Record Attempts, 2/6. No pacing allowed but followers are allowed to ride 100 yards behind.

- 4. Any member arriving late for the start of a Time Trial shall be penalised such time as he starts late, subject always to the right of appeal to the Committee.
- 5. All road events must be strictly unpaced and competitors must be clothed from neck to feet in dark clothing including a jacket which must be worn outside, and competitors must pass each other on opposite sides of the road.
- 6. Handicap events will start strictly to time. Competitors are to start at the time allotted to them or lose the time they are late. No rider can be started after fifteen minutes from the last man off. In the case of Handicaps and time trials a competitor having once started shall not be allowed a second start unless in the opinion of the timekeeper the circumstances warrant it.
- 7. A member may ride for a time standard medal in any approved Association or Open Event in the Club's name or on any day after the 1st March and before the 31st October if an approved Official Time-keeper is available and upon giving seven days' notice to the Racing Secretary at which time he must furnish details of the course he wishes to use.
- 8. No member shall take more than one medal at each distance in any one year except where a special medal is awarded.
- 9. Members must improve upon their previous best standard figures to gain another standard medal; if their previous best figures are not improved upon and the standard time is beaten a certificate shall be awarded.

- 10. That in the event of a member riding for a standard medal in a handicap or scratch event and losing time in starting his actual time will count for standard medal purposes.
- 11. A member may ride for a standard medal at a given distance, on any type of machine, any number of times during the racing season providing the undermentioned multiple standard fee is paid.

The fees for multiple attempts shall be:

6/- for 25 miles 5/- for 50 miles 3/6 for 100 miles 3/6 for 12 hours 2/6 for 24 hours

- 12. Should a member give notice to ride for a Time Trial in a Club or Open event and not ride, his fee shall be refunded to him provided he notifies the Racing Secretary by post card; such communication shall bear the day's date immediately prior to the date on which the attempt should have been made.
- 13. A member establishing a Club Record shall be awarded a Gold centre Silver Medal.


